MONTH OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS

The Church dedicates the month of September to Our Lady of Sorrows, also known as Mater Dolorosa (Mother of Sorrows). This devotion recalls the Blessed Virgin Mary's spiritual martyrdom in virtue of her perfect union with the Passion of Christ. This was her role in salvation history, and what merited her place as the spiritual Mother of all Christians.

Our Lady of Sorrows is symbolized by a single sword, or seven swords, piercing Mary's suffering heart, as foretold in Simeon's prophecy. Traditionally the Church meditates on the **"Seven Sorrows"** of our Blessed Mother: 1) the prophecy of Simeon; 2) the Holy Family's flight into Egypt; 3) the loss of the Child Jesus for three days; 4) the meeting of Mary and Jesus as he carried his cross; 5) Jesus' crucifixion and death; 6) Jesus' sacred body taken down from the cross; 7) and Jesus' burial.

The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows is September 15th.

A DIFFERENT LIFE

Our readings from Isaiah and from the Gospel of Mark confront us with the fact that the invitation to faith leads us into suffering. In Isaiah, the prophet accepts pain and shaming from others, as he trusts in God. In Mark, Jesus is blunt about this: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me."

The Gospel of Mark reaches a turning point in today's passage. About halfway through Mark, Jesus' disciples begin to understand Jesus as the Messiah (or Christ). And Jesus begins to spell out just what is expected of those who follow him.

The story then shifts to learning just what being Christ, and following Christ, actually means. Jesus shatters the expectation of a political or military power defeating Israel's oppressors, and reveals a different kind of Messiah. The disciples later come to see that this different Messiah offers a different understanding of power, and of life itself.

We inhabit a world that honors power over others, through wealth or achievement or violence. Jesus invites us into a community and a way of life that honors the power of love and service to others. Lived fully, it is truly a different way of life. It is marked by great suffering and great joy, because it embraces the fundamental pattern of the death and resurrection of Jesus.



The True Cross

Tradition tells us that the True Cross represents the physical remains which are said to be from the cross upon which Jesus was crucified. These were found at the site of the Holy Sepulchre (the Christian section of Jerusalem which is said to contain the site of the crucifixion and Jesus' empty tomb) which was once a site of veneration for the early Christian Church in Jerusalem. On orders from Emperor Hadrian the site had been covered with earth and a temple of Venus constructed.

According to post-Nicene historians, Empress Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine, the first Christian emperor of Rome, travelled to the Holy Land in 326–328. Helen had the pagan temple destroyed and the Sepulchre uncovered. There on September 14th she discovered the hiding place of three crosses that were believed to have been used at the crucifixion of Jesus and the two thieves, St. Dismas and Gestas. To one cross was attached a wooden sign bearing Jesus' name.


In Socrates' version, the three crosses were placed in turn on a deathly ill woman. This woman recovered at the touch of the third cross, which was taken as a sign that this was the cross of Christ. Fragments of the Cross were broken up, and the pieces were widely distributed.

SAINTS AND SPECIAL OBSERVANCES

Monday	St. John Chrysostom (4th cent. Bishop & Doctor of the Church; patron of epileptics, orators, lecturers)
Tuesday	The Exaltation of the Holy Cross (this feast commemorates Christ's victory over death by his crucifixion and resurrection; also the finding of the true cross by Emperor Constantine's mother, Helen, and the building of the Church of the Holy Sepulcher at the site)
Wednesday	Lady of Sorrows (variations of this name are names by which the Virgin Mary is referred to in relation to sorrows in her life, with special devotions to her Seven Sorrows) Yom Kippur (Jewish day of atonement) begins at sunset
Thursday	Pope St. Cornelius & St. Cyprian (Cornelius: 3rd cent. Roman pope & martyr, patron of domestic animals, epileptics, earache sufferers; Cyprian: contemporary of Cornelius, Roman-African bishop & martyr)
Friday	St. Robert Bellarmine (16th cent. Italian Jesuit priest, Cardinal & Doctor of the Faith; patron of canon lawyers, catechists)


