Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, Honoring Jesus as son of David, the crowds see Jesus as a living sign of hope and promise



Holy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper that Jesus shares with His apostles during which He institutes the Eucharistic meal.

Good Friday commemorates the passion of the Lord, His betrayal, mock trial, crucifixion and death at Calvary.

Holy Saturday commemorates the 40-hour-long vigil that the followers of Jesus held after his burial on Good Friday and before His resurrection on Easter Sunday. It is the close of the season of Lent and the beginning of paschal time. The Easter Vigil opens with the blessing of fire and the lighting of the paschal candle.

Easter Sunday commemorates the resurrection of Jesus, body and soul and His salvific victory over sin and death. Jesus opened the gates of heaven to those who believe and follow God's commandments, thus giving promise of eternal life in the Kingdom of God.

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD MARCH 28, 2021



Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut from the fields. Those preceding him as well as those following kept crying out: "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord."

—Mark 11:1-10

PALM SUNDAY

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week and previews its themes and events. Today's liturgy begins with the commemoration of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. The Roman Missal gives three options for how this can be done, the most elaborate of which begins with the priest, ministers, and the entire assembly outside. The Gospel account of the entry is read, after which palms are blessed and distributed. Then everyone enters the church in procession, singing songs or psalms.

However, the joy is temporary; the Passion narrative recounts how, after an intimate meal with his disciples a few days later, Jesus is arrested, tortured, crucified, and buried. The reading from Isaiah is one of four Suffering Servant songs, while the psalm likewise gives voice to the suffering of the innocent. The reading from Philippians affirms the Incarnation as God's embrace of the entire human situation, including suffering and death.

Palm Sunday invites us to follow Jesus through the rest of Holy Week. By moving us to feel the injustice and the suffering endured by Jesus, this week's liturgies and devotions present us with those same choices. But it is important to remember that we call this "Holy Week" and not "sad week" or "suffering week," for each of the readings today, even the lamentations of the psalm, end in the promise of the strength and hope that is granted by God to those who faithfully give of themselves in love. We must reflect deeply on the sufferings of Jesus, but still be confident in the joy of risen, eternal life that awaits all of us who faithfully walk with him through these days.

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PALMS FOR PALM SUNDAY

This year, due to Covid restrictions, palm branches are not available at Mass; instead, Fr. Hao and Fr. Rey invite all parishioners to bring their own leafy branches from home.

These do not need to be branches from palm trees and you are encouraged to be creative in making your own palm branches.

Please bring these to Mass on Palm Sunday for a blessing.






ASCENSION PARISHIONERS COME THROUGH AGAIN!

HOLY WEEK AND THE PASCHAL TRIDIUM

"The days of Jesus' life-giving death and glorious resurrection are approaching, the hour he triumphed over Satan's pride, the time we celebrate the great event of our redemption" (Preface of the Lord's Passion II, Sacramentary).

Thus the Church begins the one week of the year that we formally designate as "Holy."

Some simple rituals can link our "domestic church" to our parish church and the Church universal.

- ◆ Enthrone **Sunday**'s palms where you pray, behind the family crucifix, even as part of front door decorations: "Christ reigns here," they proclaim; "all are welcome!"
- ◆ During the **first three days** of Holy Week, ready Easter clothes, prepare festal foods, clean the house, beautify the yard.
- ◆ Late **Holy Thursday** afternoon, share Lent's final meal before the Lord's Supper Mass. Pitcher, bowl, and towel make a fitting centerpiece; perhaps conclude the meal by washing each other's feet.
- ◆ On **Good Friday**, observe the paschal fast from food—from TV and computer, too!
- ◆ Then come to **Holy Saturday's** Vigil with mind clear, stomach empty, and heart full of "holy anticipation" that bursts into living flame when the new fire is kindled.

GIFT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT CONNECTS PEOPLE TO CHRIST, POPE SAYS

Every Christian is unique because the Holy Spirit inspires something new and original in each person, creating "an endless field of holiness," Pope Francis said March 17 during his weekly general audience. He concluded his series of talks about prayer by looking at prayer as a relationship with the Holy Trinity, in particular with the Holy Spirit.

"The first gift of every Christian existence is the Holy Spirit," he said. It is the key, essential gift because without the Holy Spirit, "there is no relationship with Christ and with the Father."

The Spirit opens the human heart to Christ's presence "and draws it into that 'vortex' of love that is the very heart of God," he said.

Calling on the Spirit for support and inspiration is important, especially when one has not prayed in a long time, has lost the desire to pray or recites prayers "like a parrot," with no depth of feeling or faith, he said.

Christians must "keep alive this flame" of the Holy Spirit, of God's love, in their heart, the pope said, the same way the lamp next to the tabernacle stays lit "even when the church empties and darkness falls, even when the church is closed."

"No one sees it, yet it burns before the Lord," he said. "That's how the Spirit is in our heart, always present like that lamp."
